## The Creative Center at University Settlement presents culminating performance by Heather Woodbury based on her teaching experience with older adults and people living with chronic illness

**New York, NY (February 14, 2023)** – The Creative Center at University Settlement will host a live works-in-progress performance of Heather Woodbury's latest work *Periodic Fable*.

**Date:** March 11, 2023 **Time:** 6 – 7 pm

Location: Speyer Hall, in University Settlement's historic headquarters at 184 Eldridge St

The performance is free and open to the public.

In *Periodic Fable*, Woodbury weaves together three distinct endeavors while blurring the lines between past and present, and life and art. The work reflects a series of Woodbury's emergences in the wake of COVID-19 pandemic isolation, as she began reconnecting with a changed world outside. In quick succession, she moved back to New York City; traveled across the United States by train to connect with undecided voters and with her family's astonishing past; and led a cohort of older adults and persons living with chronic illness in an alchemical solo theatrical performance workshop, which culminated with a unified ensemble performance event themes of mortality, dignity, and identity.

**Sophia Heinecke**, former Arts and Wellness Manager at the The Creative Center, noted: "This has truly been a dream project for us, generously funded in full by The Rorick Trust, which has allowed an artist to approach our community with a one-of-a-kind educational experience which can also serve as a learning lab to further develop their own creative ideas to then be presented back out in our community as a visionary work of art available to all."

"In teaching solo storytelling I discovered everyone's tale had to do with 'losing' one story and having the guts to tell a new one – the 'found' part," said **Woodbury**, who served as lead artist and educator on the project. "My new performance is sparked by the participants' moving ability to do just that."

The performance of *Periodic Fable* on March 11, 2023 is presented as a collaboration between The Creative Center and <u>The Performance Project @ University Settlement.</u>
